- The Asset-Based Community Development philosophy was developed in the 1980s by Jody Kretzmann and John McKnight out of Northwestern University as a way to work with economically disadvantaged communities utilizing assets instead of deficits in its approach.
- The foundational truths about ABCD are:
 - Everyone has gifts.
 - Everyone has something to contribute.
 - Everyone cares about something and that passion is his or her motivation to act.

HSO Roundtable:

The HSO (Human Service Organizations) Roundtable has been meeting since late 2018, originally to assess opportunities regarding Medicare and Medicaid reform. The Roundtable as evolved to focus attention on developing comprehensive referral process to assist residents of Forsyth County to access services and to assist agencies in monitoring what services were received and how residents are progressing in their pursuit of their goals. The HSO Roundtable has endorsed the YMCA REACH Center as the "prototype" for the implementation of the new referral process.

The YMCA REACH Center Capital Campaign

- Planning to raise \$4M for the Capital Project, and an additional \$1.5M for endowment
- Contracted with Whitney Jones and Associates for campaign consultation
- Formed a Capital Campaign Cabinet of YMCA and community volunteers
- Honorary chairs are Elwood Robinson, Sue Henderson and John Davis
- Campaign chairs are Sylvia Oberle and David Hinton
- Campaign case finalized; naming rights developed;
- Begun initial stages of donor prospecting
- Submitted multiple proposals to prospective donors
- Have raised approximately \$200K to date
- Sustainability:
 - Plan is to partner with the Forsyth County Y branches to raise dollars through Annual Impact Fund to help support the operations of the YMCA REACH Center
